DEER WILD TURKEY	— "GUN & LATE BOW" — "SPRING"	ALL AREAS ARE OPEN EXCEPT PERMANENT CLOSED AREAS POSTED WITH "AREA CLOSED" SIGNS. (SEE MAP).
SMALL GAME AND MIGRATORY GAME BIRDS	— "STATE SEASONS" —	OPEN ONLY IN THAT AREA OF THE REFUGE LOCATED NORTH OF THE FINLEY ROAD (AREA 1A-SEE MAP).

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The Necedah National Wildlife Refuge is open to hunting in accordance with all applicable state regulations. Signs are posted throughout the refuge which identify the hunting areas delineated on the map on the reverse side of this leaflet. No special Federal hunting permit is required.

- Area 1A is open to hunting all legal species of game within state seasons. Shells containing steel shot must be used for waterfowl hunting.
- Area 1B and Area 2 are open to hunting only deer and wild turkey. All other wildlife species (including coyotes) are protected and
 may not be killed in these two areas.
- Discharging a firearm from, across, down, or alongside all roads and trails including Township Roads (see map on reverse) within the exterior boundaries of the refuge is prohibited. Target practice or shooting at random is not permitted.
- Blinds or tree stands may be used, but are not to be nailed to a tree. All tree stands must be removed at the close of shooting hours each day. The *construction* or use of blinds and platforms nailed or screwed to trees is illegal.
- Motorized vehicles are restricted to township roads. Vehicles parked so as to block gates are subject to being towed away at owner's expense. (Access must be maintained for emergency, fire and patrol vehicles.)
- Overnight camping, overnight parking, and open fires are not permitted on the refuge. Camping sites are available for fall use on the adjacent State Meadow Valley Wildlife Management Area. (See map for locations).
- Unarmed deer hunters may enter the refuge to scout out evidence of deer activity and locate their deer stand on the day prior to the applicable season. Scouting is allowed only in the area(s) to be open the following day.
- Only unarmed Wild Turkey hunt permittees are allowed to enter the Refuge to scout out turkey signs and locate their hunting stands. Hunters may begin scouting on the Saturday immediately prior to the opening date listed on their State Turkey Hunt Permit.


