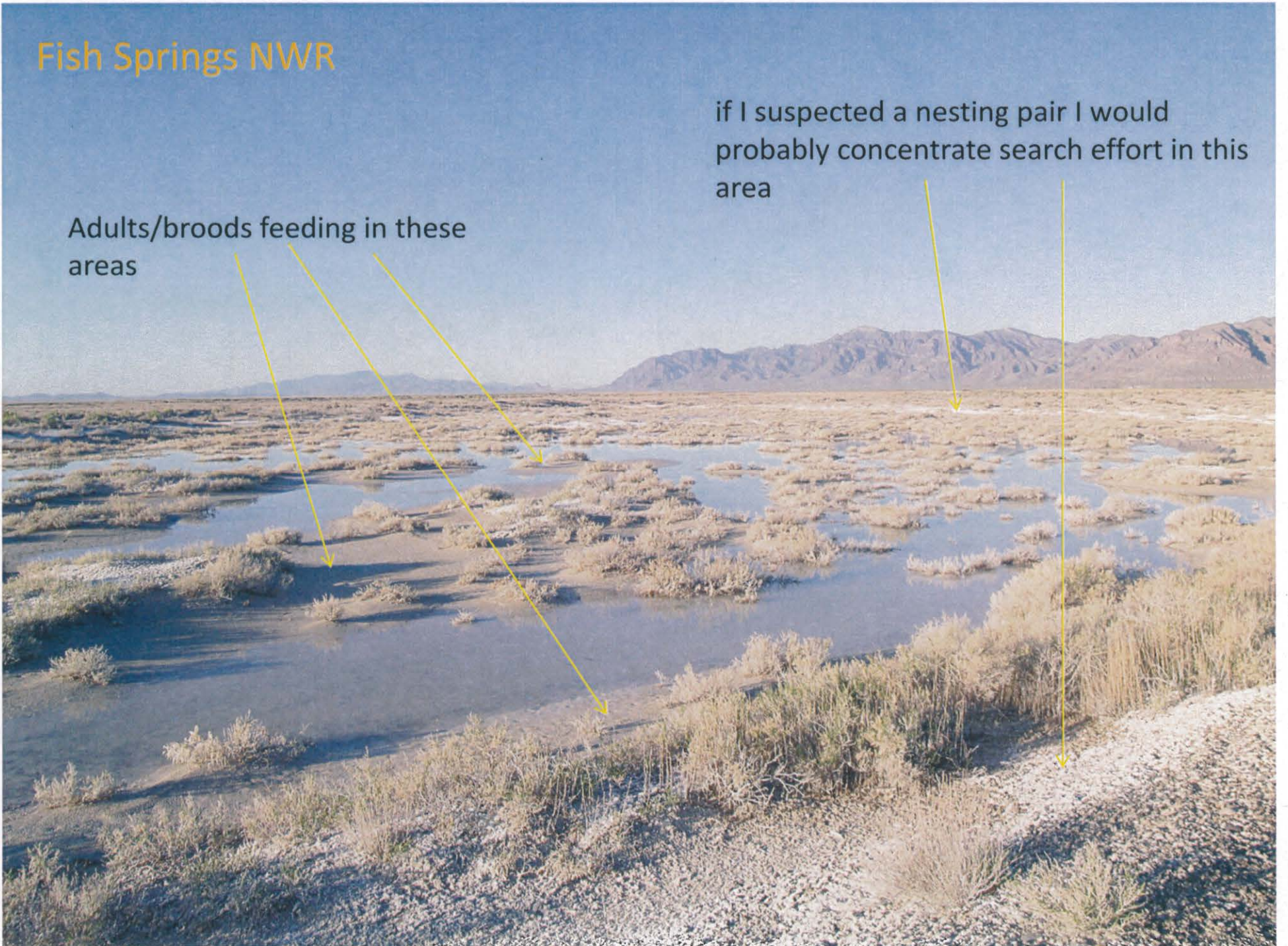


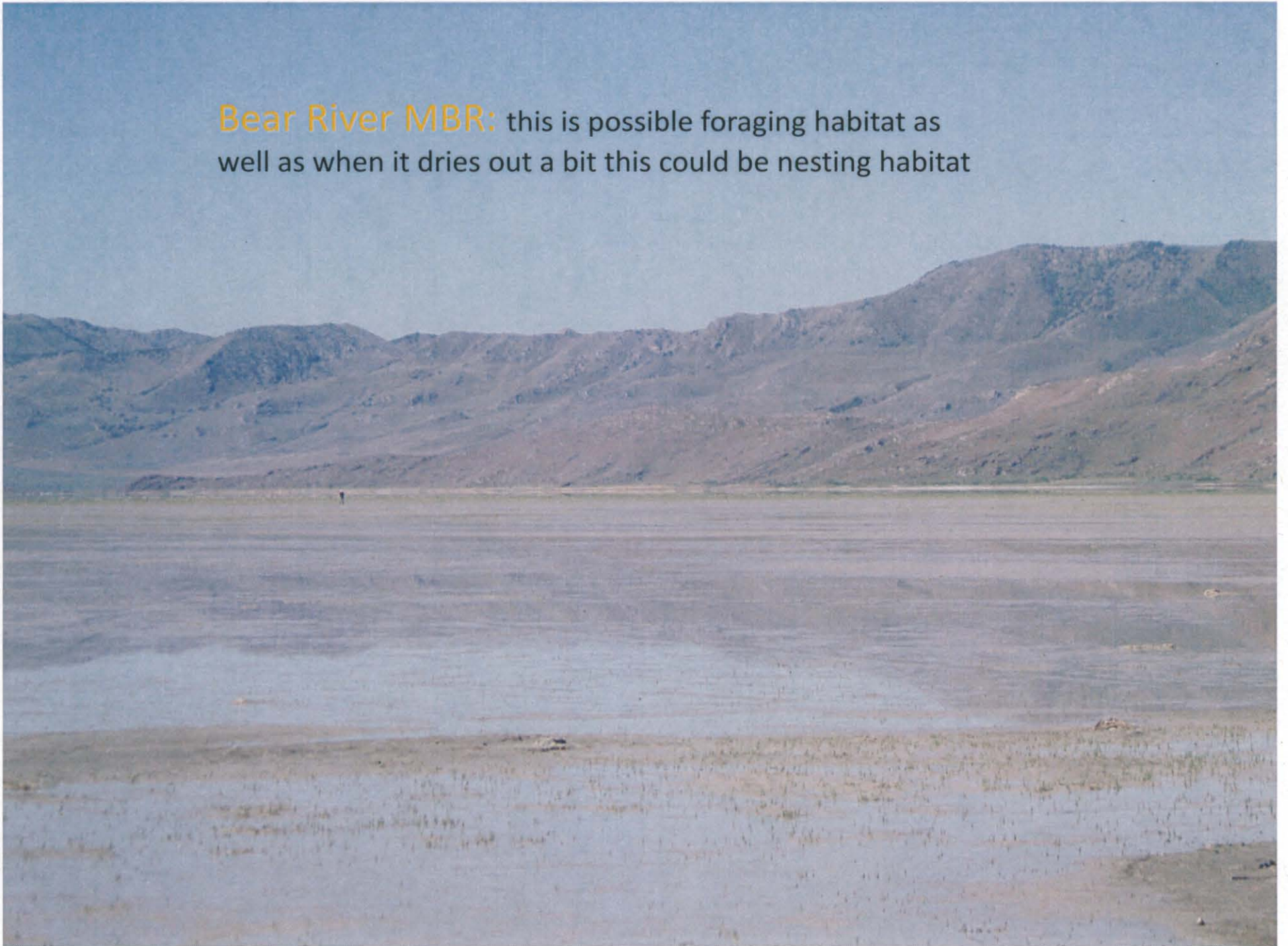
# Fish Springs NWR

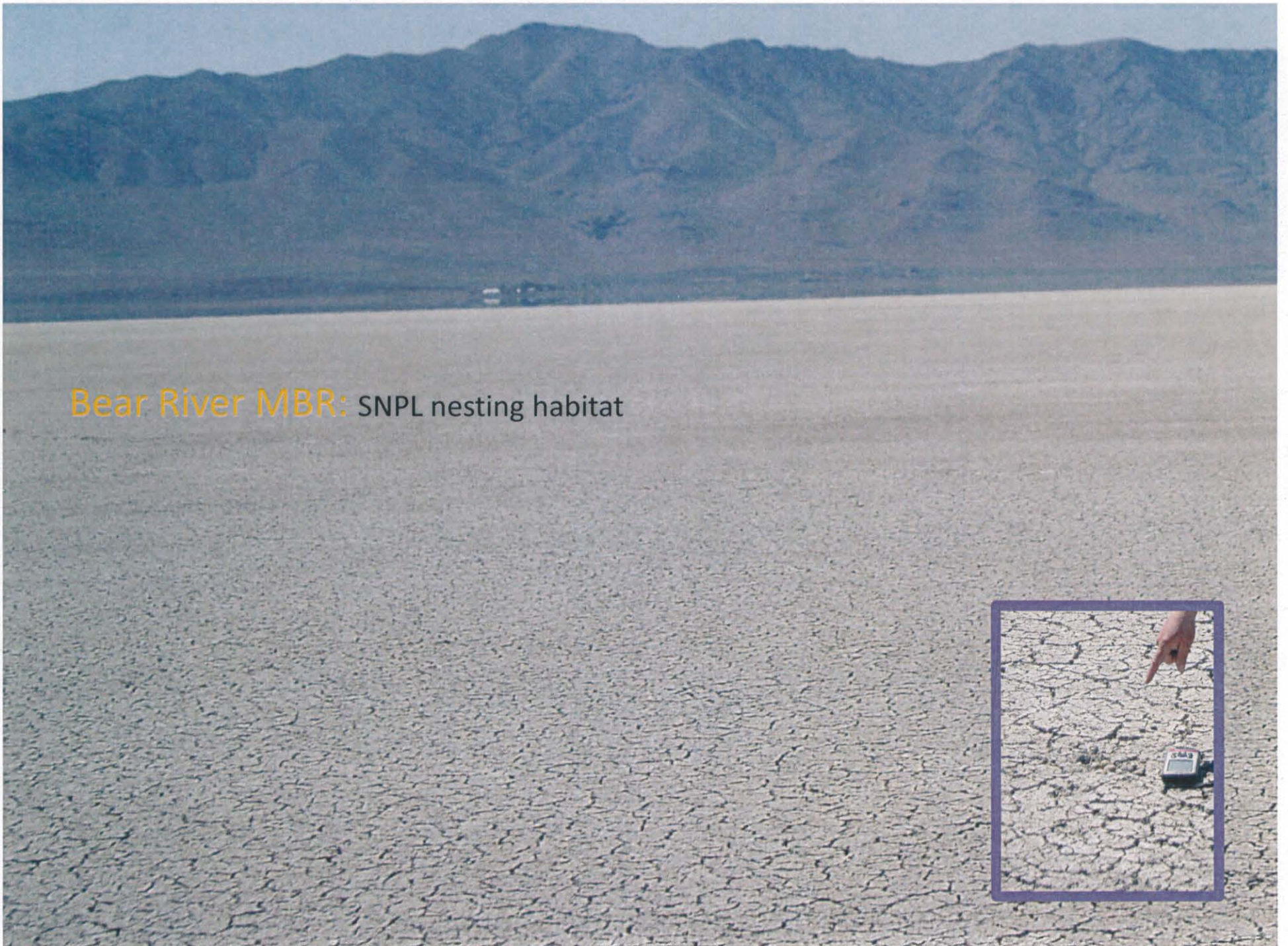
Adults/broods feeding in these areas

**Bear River MBR:** this is possible foraging habitat as well as when it dries out a bit this could be nesting habitat





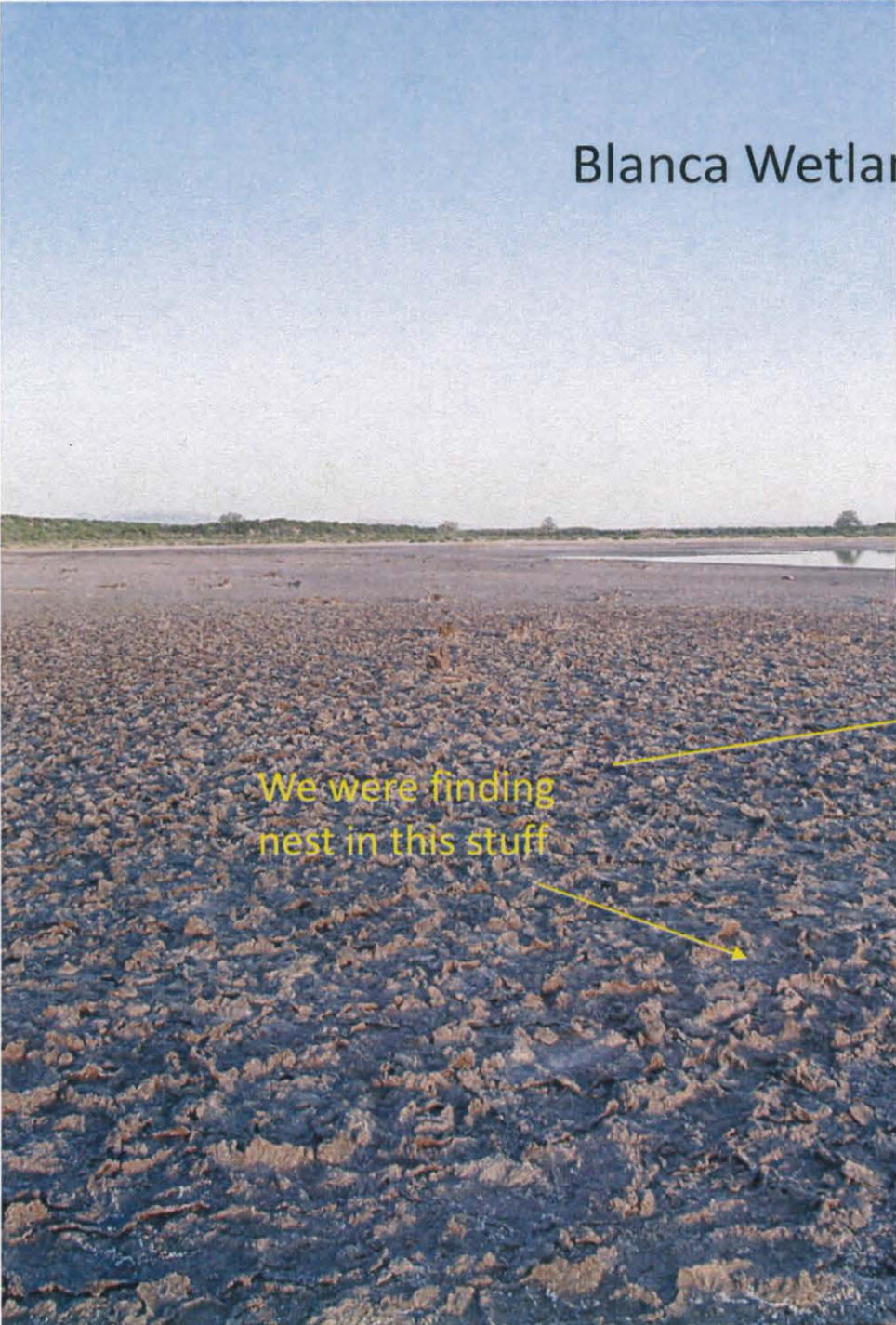
Bear River MBR: SNPL nesting habitat



**Blanca Wetlands, San Luis Valley, Colorado:** we were finding them all around these wetlands, even far into the greasewood – total surprise – foraging, loafing, chick rearing, nesting sites – not used to them using vegetation but may be a predation response at this site and/or response to heat.



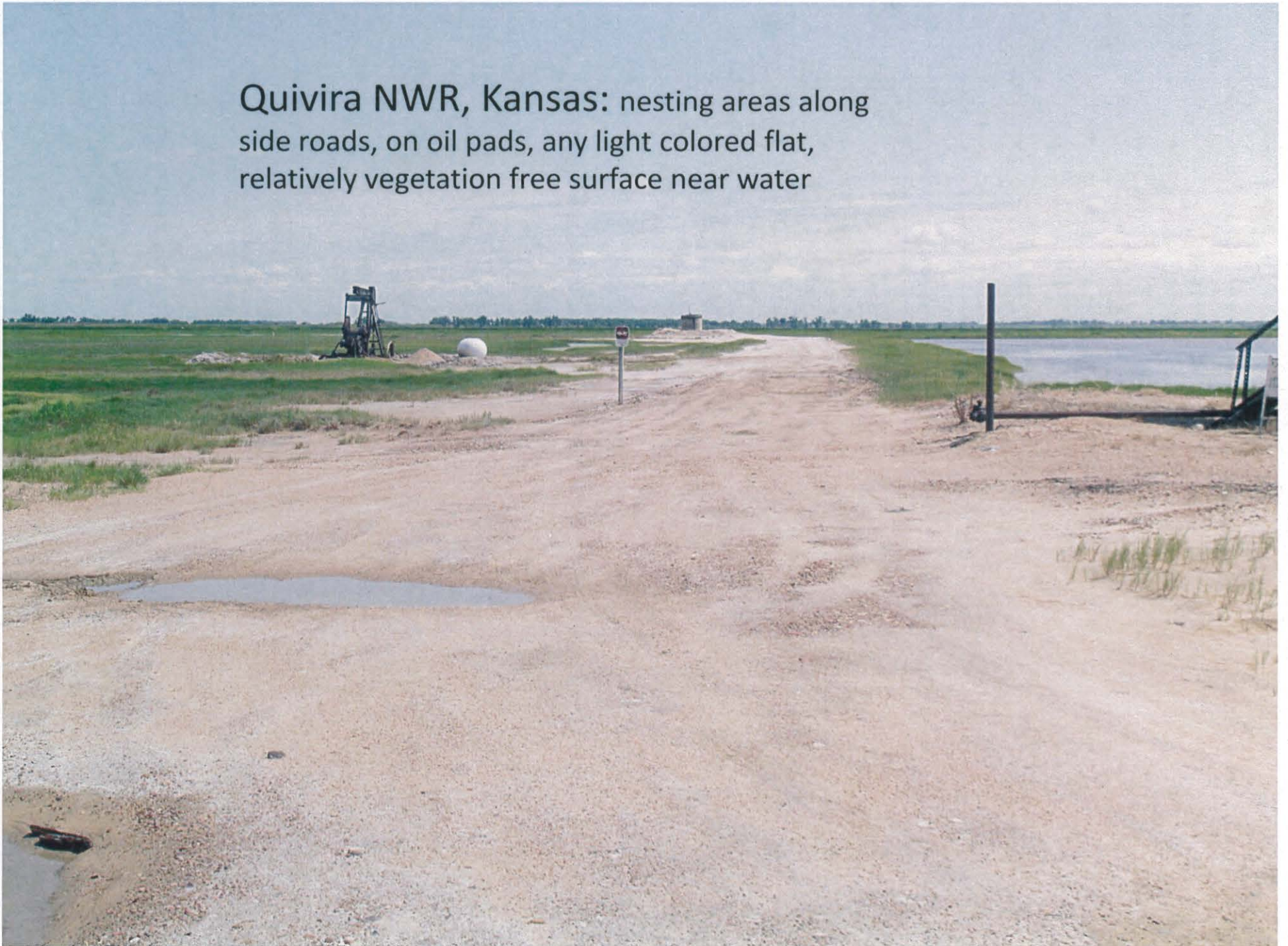
Blanca Wetlands, Colorado



We were finding nest in this stuff



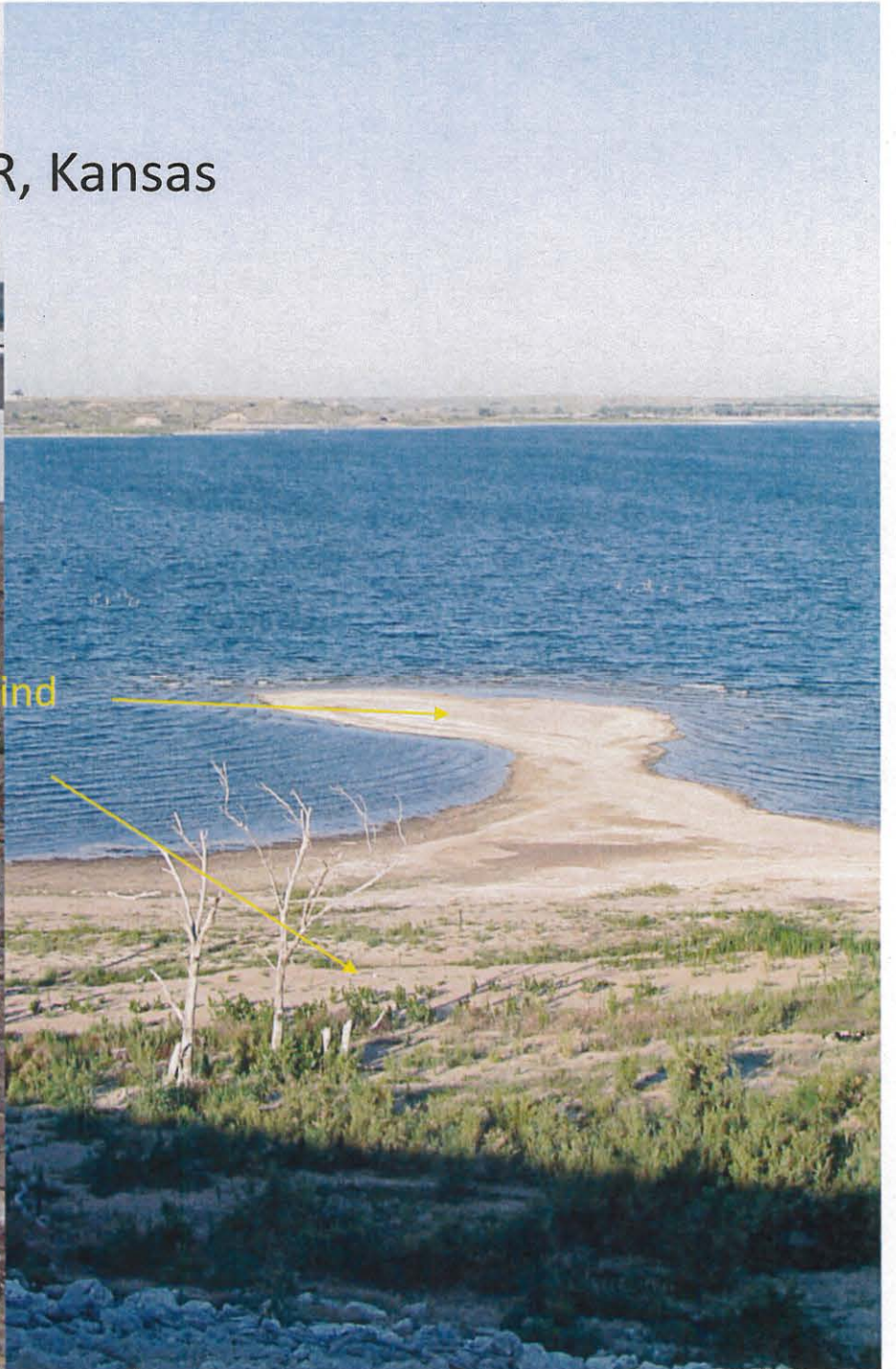
Quivira NWR, Kansas: nesting areas along side roads, on oil pads, any light colored flat, relatively vegetation free surface near water



Quivira NWR, Kansas: open areas don't have to be really big in area – this is a dried borrow ditch I have seen them use for nesting, foraging, chick rearing



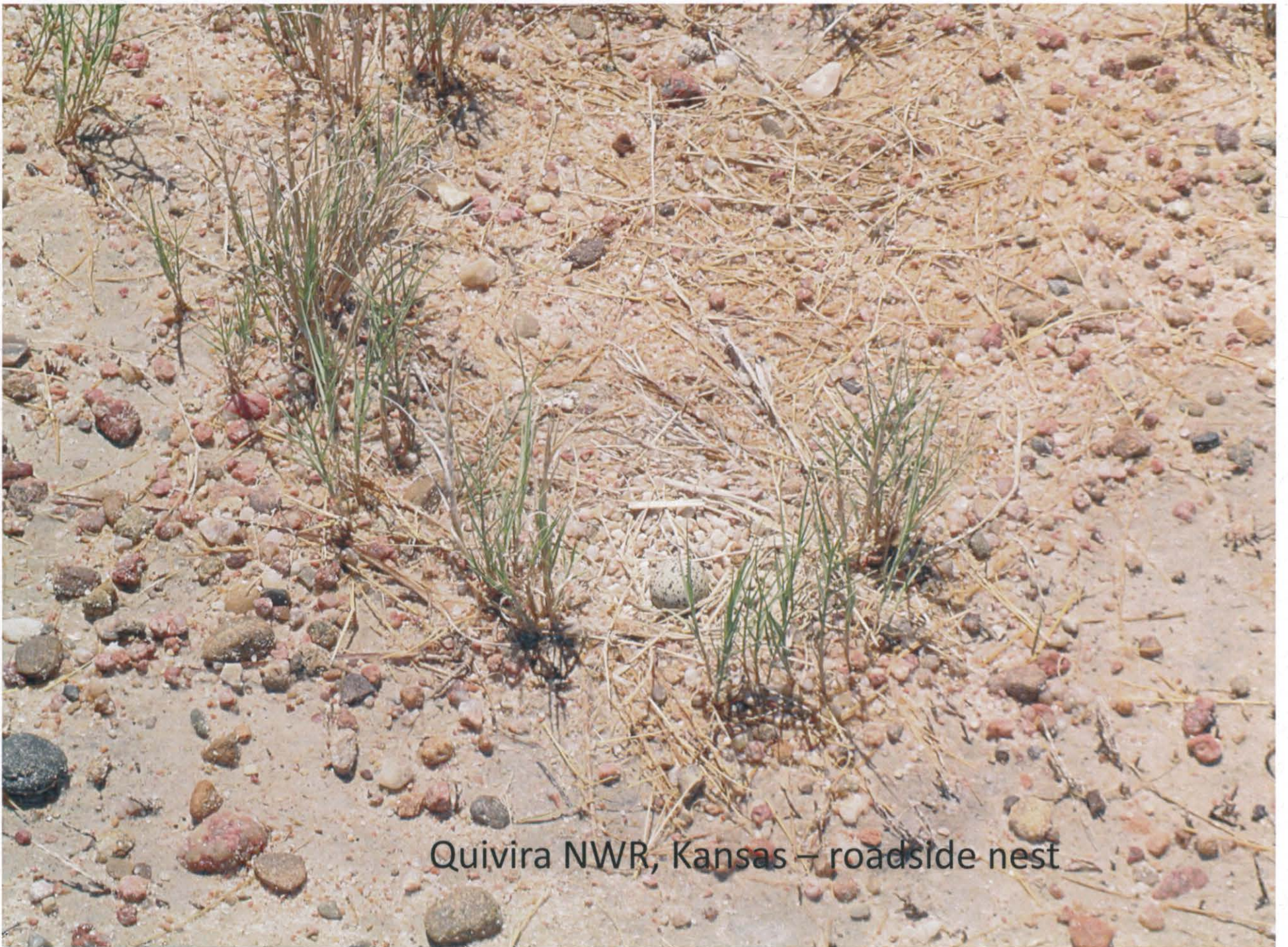

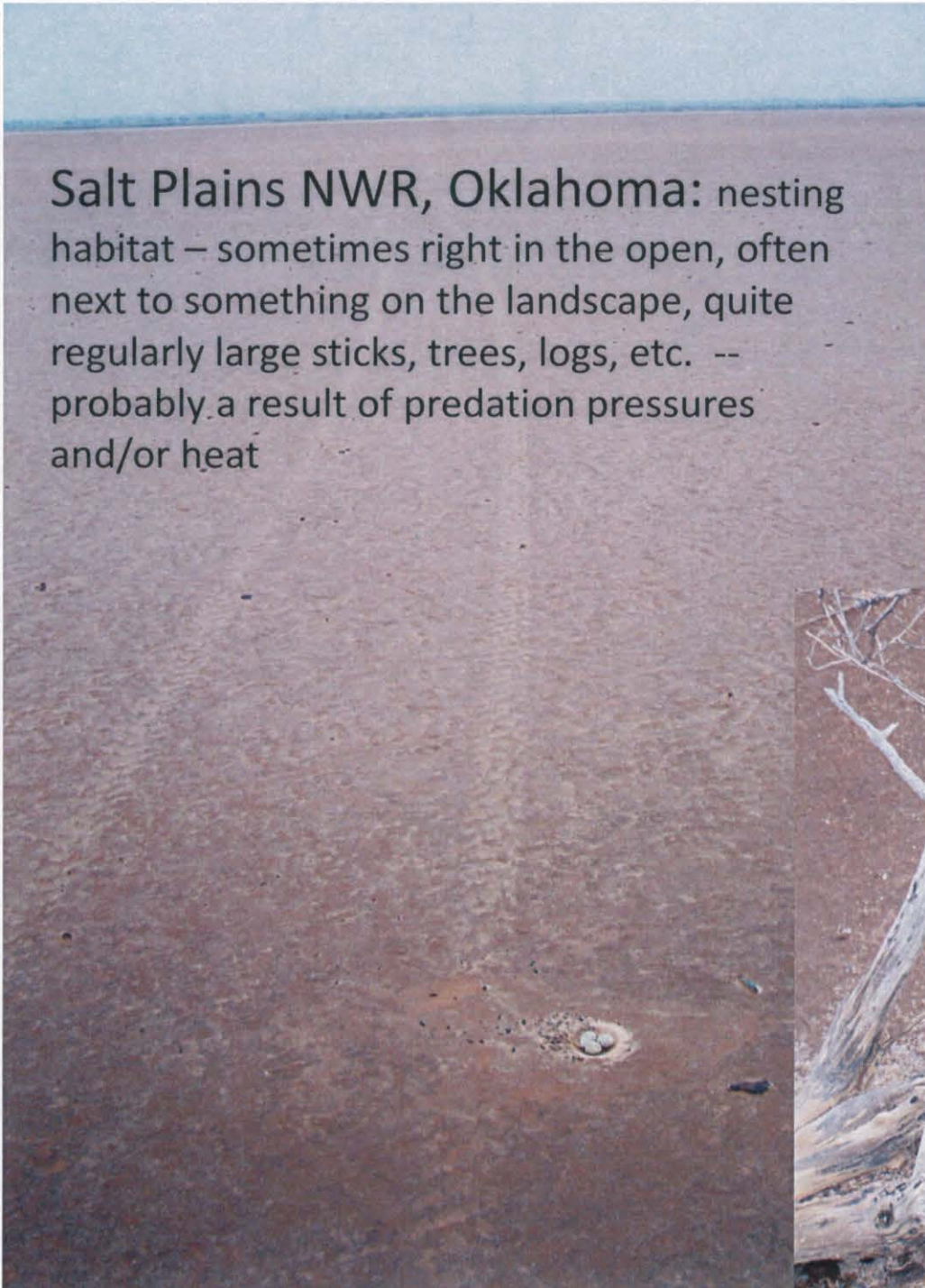


Quivira NWR, Kansas – roadside nest

Salt Plains NWR, Oklahoma:  
foraging, loafing, nesting habitat



**Salt Plains NWR, Oklahoma:** nesting habitat – sometimes right in the open, often next to something on the landscape, quite regularly large sticks, trees, logs, etc. -- probably a result of predation pressures and/or heat
