The two areas are full of water but have supported no wildlife this summer. As previously reported, both of these water areas are located in close preximinity to farm buildings, which with the stock watering disturbance, removes much of the attractiveness for waterfowl.

The reports on the Easement areas are far from satisfactory, but comprises all of the information that we now have available. The necessity of conserving auto travel has limited the amount of time and trips to such a reas. Contacts have been established whereby anything of importance in connection with the areas will be reported to us. As a trip to the Lake Andes and Lake Arconge Refuges will be necessary this month in order to make repairs to the structures, it was not believed important enough to make a special trip over there during August to obtain information for this report. An effort will be made to have more detailed information for the December 31, report.
