Special Terms and Conditions for Permit TE85855B-0

- E. Acceptance of this permit serves as evidence that the permittee and its authorized agents understand and agree to abide by the terms of this permit and all sections of Title 50 Code of Federal Regulations, parts 13 and 17, pertinent to issued permits.
- F. The authorization granted by this permit is subject to full and complete compliance with, and implementation of, the Safe Harbor Agreement executed by the permittee and the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. This permit and the Safe Harbor Agreement are binding upon the permittee and any authorized officer, employee, contractor, or agent conducting permitted activities.
- G. The permittee and its authorized officers, employees, contractors, or agents are authorized to incidentally take the northern spotted owl (*Strix occidentalis caurina*) in the course of conducting otherwise lawful forest management and timber harvest activities in accordance with the Safe Harbor Agreement and the permit.
- H. The permittee will notify the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Oregon Fish and Wildlife Office, within fourteen working days if new locations of nesting northern spotted owls are discovered on the covered lands.
- I. Upon locating any injured or sick individuals of northern spotted owls, permittee will notify the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, Oregon Fish and Wildlife Office, within one working day. Upon locating any dead northern spotted owls, notification will be within five working days. Instructions for proper handling and disposition of such specimens will be provided at that time.
- J. Reports submitted in compliance with this permit must include the following certification from a responsible official who supervised or directed the preparation of the report:

“Under penalty of law, I certify that, to the best of my knowledge, after appropriate inquiries of all relevant persons involved in the preparation of this report, the information submitted is true, accurate, and complete.”
- K. A copy of this permit must be on the premises of the Permittee, or in the possession of the Permittee, or their designated agents, while conducting activities that may result in incidental take.
- L. Permittee shall refer to permit number TE85855B-0 on all correspondence and reports concerning permit activities.
